## **Milestones of CAN Futsal, South Africa 2016**

Referred to as African Futsal Championship until 2015, the Africa Futsal Cup of Nations is the major futsal competition in Africa. The first edition took place in 1996 and the tournament, held every four years, is also a qualifier for the FIFA Futsal World Cup.

The 2016 edition will be held from 15-24 April in South Africa, and counts as the fifth edition overall after the 2011 edition scheduled for Burkina Faso was cancelled.

The eight qualified teams are housed into two groups of four teams each following the draw for the final tournament held on 17 February 2016 in Johannesburg, South Africa. The first two from each group will qualify for the semi-finals.

At the end, the top three teams will represent Africa at the FIFA Futsal World Cup in Colombia. These include the winner, losing finalists and the third-place team.

### **Group A**

#### **South Africa**

The best performance by the host country remains the fourth place in 2000. With the support of the home crowd, the host will be eyeing at least a minimum target of qualification to the World Cup. And that will begin with a place at the last four.

## **Mozambique**

The Mozambicans, fourth in 2008 and runner-up four years earlier are ranked amongst the regular faces in the history of the quadrennial championships. They qualified at the expense of Madagascar.

## **Zambia**

They are the third team from Southern Africa in a group, which has no previous winner. The Zambians showed character during the qualifiers edging Equatorial Guinea on away goals after a 7-7 tie on aggregate.

## **Tunisia**

Like Zambia, the Tunisians are the outsiders in the group. However, they can only know their true worth after their first match, after qualifying without kicking following the withdrawal of Nigeria.

## **GROUP B**

### **Egypt**

Three-time winners Egypt are the favourites. The Pharaohs lost out to fellows, Libya, 4-3 in the final of the last edition in 2008 in Tripoli. They also boast of an enviable record of having participated at every edition of the FIFA Futsal World Cup since 1996, reaching the second round in 2000 and 2012.

### **Libya**

Despite the political instability back home, Libya, winners of the last edition in 2008 on home soil put the political turmoil behind them to beat Sudan to qualify. They will face rivals Egypt in the Group B opener in a battle of familiar foes. Libya has also represented Africa twice at the FIFA Futsal World Cup, 2008 and 2012.

### **Angola**

On paper, Angola appears the dark horses in a group that include two former champions. However, the opponents can afford to underrate them at their peril as the Portuguese speaking country takes inspiration from Brazil and Portugal, considered references for the indoor sport. The Angolans completed a double over Cameroon to book their ticket to South Africa.

### **Morocco**

Finalist in 2000, third in 2004 and 2008, Morocco is a serious contender for the title, despite finding themselves in the 'Group of Death' which has two former winners, Egypt and Libya. One of three African representatives at the FIFA Futsal World Cup in Thailand in 2012, they were merciless in the qualifiers, thumping Cote d'Ivoire 12-2 on aggregate.
