MATCH FACTS

Ghana and Algeria will meet in what looks like an evenly matched TotalEnergies CAF Women's Africa Cup of Nations (WAFCON) Morocco 2024 quarterfinal in Berkane on Saturday (kick-off 17:00 local time / 16:00 GMT).

This will be the fourth meeting between the sides at WAFCON. In their three previous clashes, Ghana won twice and Algeria once. Each of those previous meetings produced a winner, with all victories coming by a single-goal margin.

Their first encounter came in the 2010 group stage. Algeria led through Isma Ouadah in the 4th minute before Ghana came back with a second-half brace from Agnes Aduako to win 2-1.

In 2014, Algeria claimed their only win, 1-0, thanks to an 87th-minute goal from Houria Affak in their Group B opener.

Their most recent meeting came in the 2018 group stage, where Ghana won 1-0 via a 13th-minute strike from Gladys Amfobea. All three past encounters were group-stage matches, and in none of those years did either team progress beyond the group phase.

17 November 2018 – Group A: Ghana 1 (Amfobea 13') Algeria 0 – Accra Sports Stadium, Ghana



ALGERIA FACTS

- ◆ Making their sixth WAFCON appearance, Algeria have reached the knockout stage for the first time after five group-stage eliminations.
- ◆ Only Mali had more group-stage exits (six) before reaching a knockout round, doing so in 2018.
- ◆ Algeria went unbeaten in the group stage for the first time in their WAFCON history.
- ◆ Did not concede a single goal in the group stage, only Nigeria matched that record.
- ◆ Have now gone 276 minutes without conceding at WAFCON. Their last goal conceded was in the 83rd minute of a 3-2 loss to Mali in 2018.
- ◆ Scored just one goal across their three group games, the lowest total among the quarterfinalists.
- ◆ This is their lowest scoring output at a WAFCON group stage when playing three matches.
- ◆ If they reach the semifinals, Algeria would become only the second North African team to do so, after Morocco.
- ◆ Two North African teams reached the quarterfinals in 2022, Morocco won, Tunisia lost.
- ◆ Held Nigeria to a draw in their last group game, avoiding defeat to the Super Falcons for the first time.
- ◆ Failed to register a shot on target against Nigeria, the only match of the current finals in which they didn't manage one.
- ◆ Have scored once from 13 shots on target (conversion rate of 4.17%), the lowest among the eight quarterfinalists.
- ◆ Against Nigeria, Wassila Alouache won eight duels, the joint-highest in the match and the most by an Algerian player.



GHANA FACTS

- ❖ Failed to win their opening two group matches, but defeated Tanzania 4-1 in their final group game.
- ❖ This is Ghana's seventh appearance in the WAFCON knockout rounds. A win will take them to a seventh semifinal.
- ❖ This is their first WAFCON quarterfinal, as previous appearances beyond the group stage were direct semifinal entries.
- ❖ Their WAFCON direct knockout record (including shootouts): P6 W3 L3.
- ❖ All six previous knockout games were semifinals.
- ❖ Have only been involved in one WAFCON penalty shootout, a 0-0 third-place playoff draw with Ethiopia in 2004, which they won 6-5 on penalties.
- ❖ Two of their knockout games went to extra time. In 2002 they beat Cameroon 3-2 with a 120th-minute Golden Goal. In 2004 they lost 1-0 to Cameroon on a 96th-minute Silver Goal.
- ❖ All three of Ghana's WAFCON knockout wins were in open play, 4-1 vs DR Congo (1998), 3-2 vs Cameroon (2002), and 1-0 vs South Africa (2006).
- ❖ Knockout losses came in semifinals: 1-0 defeats to South Africa (2000), Cameroon (2004), and Cameroon again (2016).
- ❖ Beyond the group stages, Ghana have played 12 WAFCON matches (W6 L6), including semifinals and third-place playoffs.
- ❖ Had 10 shots on target vs Tanzania, their most in a game at the current tournament. Managed only eight across their first two matches.
- ❖ Shot conversion rate stands at 12.5%, improved by the 4-1 win over Tanzania.

- ◆ Scored just once from their first eight shots on target in the tournament's first two games.
- ◆ Are the only quarterfinalist yet to keep a clean sheet at WAFCON 2024.
- ◆ Have conceded in all of their last five WAFCON matches. Their last clean sheet was a 1-0 win over Algeria in 2018.
- ◆ Chantelle Boye-Hlorkah had four shots on target, a goal, and an assist vs Tanzania, the most active player in that game.
- ◆ Alice Kusi has scored in back-to-back matches. If she scores again, she will be the first Ghanaian to score in three consecutive WAFCON games since Elizabeth Addo in 2016.
- ◆ Have had 18 shots on target at the finals, second-most behind South Africa (19).
- ◆ Of all quarterfinalists, Ghana are the only side without a clean sheet in the tournament.

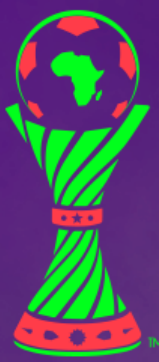

MATCH FACTS

Defending champions South Africa take on Senegal in their TotalEnergies CAF Women's Africa Cup of Nations (WAFCON) quarterfinal in Oudja on Saturday (kick-off 20:00 local time / 19:00 GMT).

This is the second meeting between South Africa and Senegal at WAFCON, but their first in a knockout game. They previously met in the group stages in 2012, where South Africa won 1-0 in Malabo, Equatorial Guinea, with the only goal scored by Andisiwe MCGoyi in the 70th minute.

South Africa are unbeaten in their last six games in open play against West African opposition. Their last defeat came in the third-place playoff against Ghana in 2016.

Since then, South Africa have won five games against West African teams in open play, beating Nigeria twice (2018 and 2022 group stages), Mali twice (2018 semifinal and 2024 group stage), and Ghana (2024 group stage). The only non-win was a 0-0 draw against Nigeria in the 2018 final, which they lost on penalties.

During this run, they've kept five clean sheets and conceded just once, in a 2-1 win over Nigeria in 2022, scoring 11 goals in total.

Senegal will face Southern African opponents for the fourth time. In addition to the 2012 loss to South Africa, they drew 1-1 with Zambia in the 2022 quarterfinals (lost on penalties) and lost 3-2 to Zambia in the group stages of the current tournament.

South Africa scored seven goals in the group stage, while Senegal scored six.

Both teams have a shot conversion rate of 20%.

Both teams faced 13 shots on target. South Africa conceded just one goal; Senegal conceded three.



SOUTH AFRICA FACTS

- ◆ Have reached the knockout rounds for the 11th time and the ninth in a row.
- ◆ Progressed through the group stages with six goals scored and one conceded.
- ◆ Defeated Mali 4-0 in their final group game to top Group C and extended their unbeaten run in open play at WAFCON to 14 games (W11 D3).
- ◆ Have scored in their last nine WAFCON games, last failing to do so in the 2018 final against Nigeria (0-0 draw, lost on penalties).
- ◆ Under Desiree Ellis, South Africa have reached the knockout rounds in four of five major tournaments (four WAFCONs and the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup).
- ◆ Have reached the semifinal stage in 10 previous WAFCON editions; only failed to do so in 1998 and 2004.
- ◆ Have won all three direct knockout games under Ellis: 2-0 vs Mali (2018 SF), 1-0 vs Tunisia (2022 QF), and 1-0 vs Zambia (2022 SF).
- ◆ Their only other WAFCON quarterfinal was a 1-0 win over Tunisia in 2022 (goal by Jermaine Seoposenwe).
- ◆ Have kept four clean sheets in five post-group-stage matches under Ellis, conceding only once, in the 2022 final against Morocco.
- ◆ Have won their last three direct WAFCON knockout games; last knockout defeat was 1-0 vs Nigeria in the 2016 semifinal.
- ◆ Under Ellis at WAFCON: P14 W11 D3, undefeated in open play.

- ◆ Have kept eight clean sheets in those 14 matches.
- ◆ Lebogang Ramalepe has been involved in three goals (1 goal, 2 assists) and has created six chances, the most by a South African player.
- ◆ Goalkeeper Andile Dlamini has kept two clean sheets in two appearances (vs Ghana and Mali), making five saves in each.
- ◆ Dlamini has made 10 saves so far, just one fewer than her total across six matches in 2022.
- ◆ Record in direct knockout WAFCON games (QFs and SFs): W6 L5.
- ◆ Have never won a penalty shootout at WAFCON. Lost 5-4 to Cameroon in 2006 (3rd-place playoff) and 4-3 to Nigeria in the 2018 final.
- ◆ Ramalepe and Linda Motlhalo missed in the 2018 shootout.
- ◆ Have scored in nine straight WAFCON games; 2018 final was the only time they've failed to score in their last 14 WAFCON matches.
- ◆ Completed 967 passes in the group stage, including 361 vs Mali, with 81.3% accuracy.
- ◆ Registered 680 touches of the ball against Mali.



SENEGAL FACTS

- ◆ Have qualified for the knockout rounds for the second time (also in 2022); exited the group stage in 2012.
- ◆ Opened with a 4-0 win over DR Congo, then lost 3-2 to Zambia and 1-0 to Morocco.
- ◆ Had three shots on target vs Morocco but failed to score; scored six goals from their first 10 shots on target in the first two games.
- ◆ Held only 36% possession vs Morocco, their lowest share of the tournament.
- ◆ Their only previous WAFCON knockout game was a 2022 quarterfinal vs Zambia, which they lost on penalties after a 1-1 draw.
- ◆ Have lost their last two games; have only once previously lost three in a row (2012 group stage).
- ◆ The win over DR Congo is their only win in the last five games (D1 L4).
- ◆ All three of their games at the current finals have featured first-half goals. Seven of the 10 total goals (scored/conceded) in their matches came in the first half.
- ◆ Have scored five of their six goals in the first half and conceded two goals in each half.
- ◆ Have never been involved in a 0-0 draw in 10 WAFCON matches. Nine were decided in open play; one (2022 QF) was decided on penalties.
- ◆ Completed 148 passes against Morocco. Goalkeeper Adji Ndiaye completed the most (24). Only two outfield players completed more than 20.
- ◆ A win would send them to their first WAFCON semifinal. Only Algeria and Senegal among the quarterfinalists have never made the semis.

- ◆ Their 4-0 win over DR Congo and South Africa's 4-0 win over Mali are the joint biggest wins at the current tournament.
- ◆ South Africa are the fourth team Senegal have faced more than once at WAFCON, after DRC, Morocco, and Zambia.
- ◆ Lost their first game against DRC in 2012 and beat them this year. Lost both games to Morocco and both to Zambia.

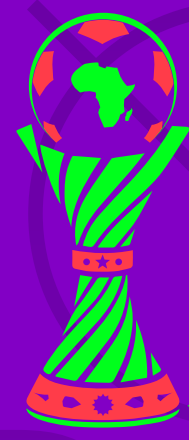
