Thank you for being part of this journey. Together, we will continue to build strong foundations for a dynamic future for African football.

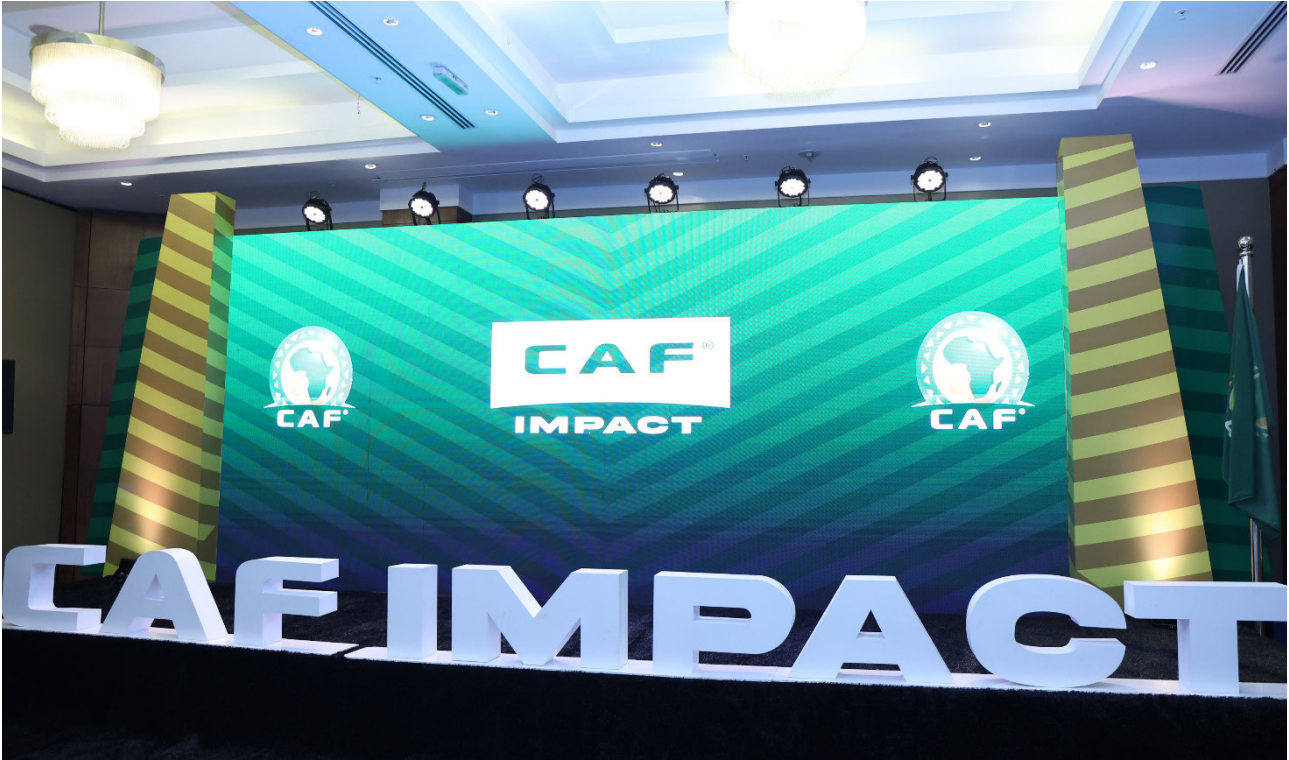

## CAF IMPACT Programme: Refresher Webinar for 54 Federations



**Following the launch of the CAF IMPACT Programme in later 2025, CAF hosted a CAF IMPACT refresher webinar series on March 3 and 4, 2026, targeting General Secretaries and Finance Managers across all 54 Member Associations.**

These sessions were designed to provide hands-on guidance on the CAF IMPACT Programme’s reporting requirements and financial safeguards.

This initiative follows the successful Strategic Roundtable Workshop held in August 2025, in Kampala, Uganda and Nairobi, Kenya. This historic event marked the first time Presidents and General Secretaries from across the continent gathered in a single forum hosted by CAF to align on governance and operational excellence.

The workshop established the groundwork for the IMPACT Programme’s mission: transforming African football through disciplined financial management and impactful community outreach.

CAF disbursed the second tranche of IMPACT Programme funds in January 2026. In accordance with Article 6.1.b.ii of the programme regulations, each Member Association received up to USD 200,000 to support their ongoing footballing initiatives. This reflects CAF’s commitment to providing resources to fuel the sustainable growth of the Member Associations.

## Beyond the Pitch: CAF Young Reporters – Internship at CANAL +



**The CAF African Schools Football Championship has evolved into a premier educational and social platform, far exceeding the boundaries of the pitch on the Continent.**

Following the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between CAF and CANAL+ in January 2025, CAF is pleased to announce the successful conclusion of the Young Reporters Internship in partnership with CANAL+.

The four best aspiring journalists from Ghana recently completed an elite training program in Paris at the CANAL + Headquarter. This initiative transforms the tournament into a classroom, providing youth with the “real-world” skills needed to lead Africa’s sports journalism and broadcasting future.

The programme continued with advanced training sessions focusing on professional preparation before major matches. The participants learned how journalists build research files, organise key information, and prepare commentary notes.

For the four selected, this was their first international professional exposure, proving that the CAF African Schools Football Championship serves as a life-changing bridge between the field of play and global career opportunities.

# CAF Football Management Executive Programme concludes in Cape Town



**CAF has successfully concluded the second edition of its CAF Football Management Executive Programme in partnership with the University of Cape Town.**

A graduation ceremony held on January 30, 2026, marked the completion of the five-month course, which serves as a central pillar of CAF’s strategy to professionalize football administration across the continent.

A total of 35 participants from all six Zonal Unions graduated from the intensive program, gaining expertise in strategic planning, commercial development, and organizational leadership. Led by a faculty of international industry experts, the curriculum was specifically designed to equip Member Associations with the advanced skillsets required to navigate the complexities of modern sports governance.

CAF Director of Member Associations,

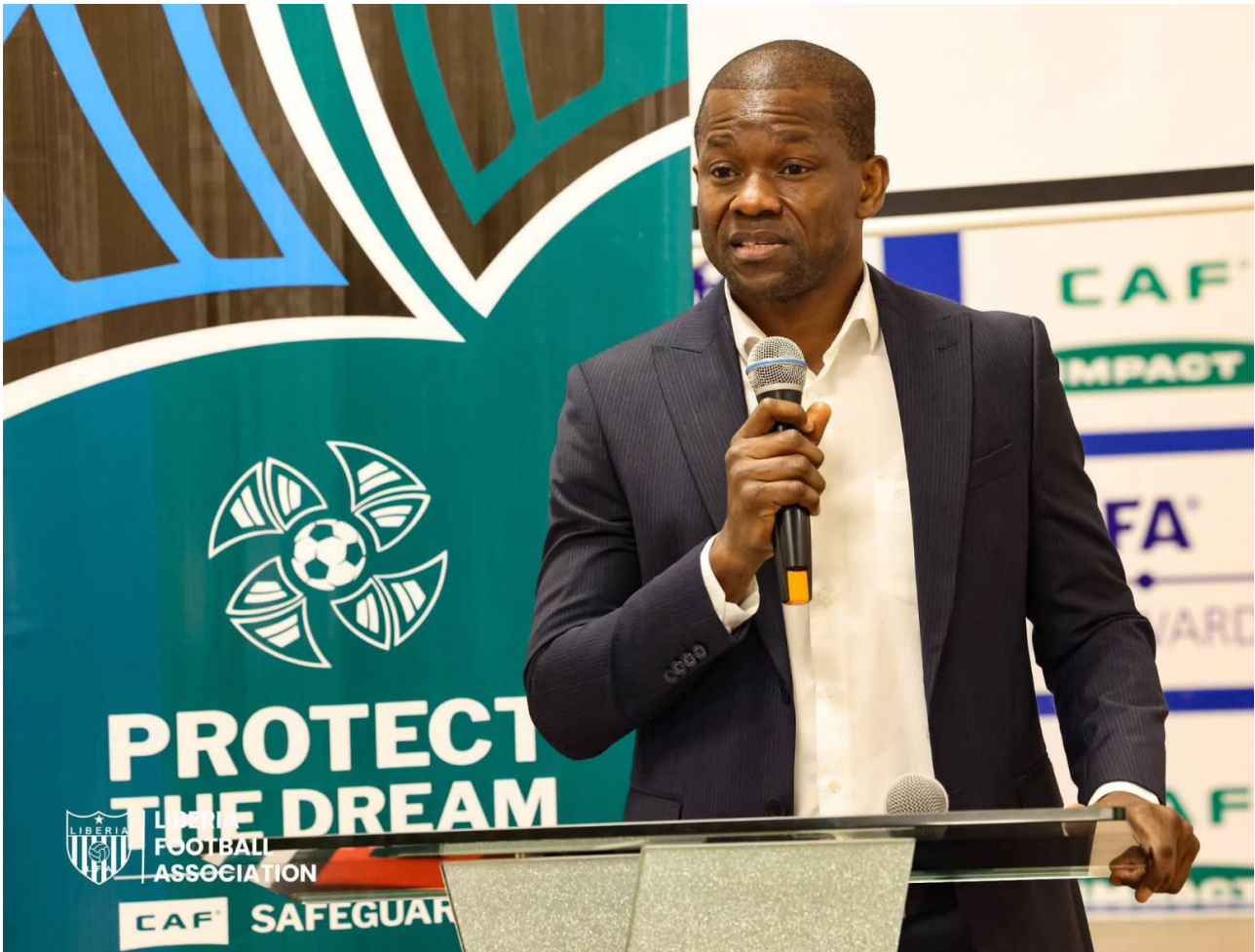

## Launch of the CAF Safeguarding Toolkit - Liberia



**The CAF Safeguarding programme has reached a major milestone with the much-anticipated official rollout of the CAF Safeguarding Toolkit, as part of the CAF IMPACT Programme and launched under the “Protect The Dream” initiative.**

Designed to establish a consistent framework for protection across African football, the toolkit provides federations, clubs, and academies with essential guidance on risk prevention, reporting mechanisms, and the protection of children, women, and vulnerable persons.

To kick off the implementation, Liberia hosted a successful two-day pilot workshop involving over 35 participants from local clubs and academies. The

training sessions focused on integrating safeguarding practices into every level of the game, from grassroots and women’s football to high-level administration and competition management.

Liberia Football Association President Mustafa Raji closed the event by reinforcing that robust safeguarding is not just a moral obligation, but a cornerstone of professional growth and institutional development within the sport.

## New Leadership for CECAFA: President Paulos Weldehaimanot Elected unopposed



**The Council of East and Central Africa Football Associations (CECAFA) has entered a new chapter following the election of Paulos Weldehaimanot Andemariam as Zonal Union President for a four-year term.**

CAF President Dr Patrice Motsepe congratulates newly elected CECAFA President Paulos Weldehaimanot Andemariam. The election took place during the CECAFA Elective General Assembly held in Djibouti on 7 February. President Paulos, who also serves as President of the Eritrean National Football Federation, was elected unopposed, reflecting broad confidence in his leadership.

In his acceptance address, President Paulos outlined a forward-looking vision focused on strengthening governance and sustainability. He committed to upholding accountability and integrity while actively pursuing new sponsorship opportunities to elevate football development across East and Central Africa.

The newly elected Executive Committee brings together a diverse and experienced

leadership team. Ali Abdi Mohamed (Somalia) assumes the role of Vice President, joined by Francis Amin Michael (South Sudan) and Shema Ngoga Fabrice (Rwanda) as members of the Executive Committee. Their appointment comes at a strategic moment for CECAFA, as the region prepares for major upcoming competitions.

The General Assembly was further honoured by the presence of representatives from FIFA and Confédération Africaine de Football, who reaffirmed their full support for the new administration.

With a clear mandate from its 11 Member Associations, the new CECAFA leadership is set to drive institutional growth, reinforce professional standards, and advance football development throughout the region.

## MA IN SPOTLIGHT: The ZIFA Roots Impact Programme Launched



**The Zimbabwe Football Association (ZIFA) has launched the Roots Impact Programme, a groundbreaking initiative designed to formalize football at its foundational level.**

By introducing the nation’s first standardized junior league structure, the programme establishes a clear progression route for young talent while embedding essential governance and safeguarding frameworks.

ZIFA is prioritizing long-term development by integrating safeguarding, anti-doping awareness, referee training, and CAF D coaching courses specifically for educators.

Strategic partnerships are the engine of this movement, specifically the collaboration between ZIFA and the Ministry of Primary and Secondary Education. This synergy

ensures that talent identification and technical training are woven into the fabric of daily student life, backed by ZIFA’s ongoing technical guidance and capacity-building support.

ZIFA President Nqobile Magwizi noted, “This is about rebuilding Zimbabwean football by design, not by chance. For too long, our youth football ecosystem has been fragmented. The Roots Impact Programme brings structure, governance and clarity. They ensure that a talented child, whether from an urban suburb or a rural community, has a fair and visible pathway into the national football system.”
